Update from Myanmar

You may remember that we raised around €12,000 for the mission of the Diocese of Banmaw in the face of the civil war in Myamnar. These funds were used to provide electrical generators, tents and rice for displaced people. The following is an email received from the Bishop of Bammaw:

The Cathedral in the Diocese of Banmaw is dedicated to St Patrick. A series of intense fighting has been going on there since December. Sadly St Patrick's Cathedral was set on fire on 16 March at 4pm (eve of the feast day) and badly damaged. However the external structure of the Cathedral was miraculously saved. It was built by the Columban Fathers (Dalgan Park, Navan) and dedicated in 1960. It has been standing more than half a century as an historical religious place and sanctuary of many people for worship and praise.

Apart from the Cathedral, the whole compound of the parish has been reduced to ashes. We are very much shocked and saddened by the destruction. Please pray for us to sustain our faith and hope in peace and justice in this situation.
